The Trustees confirm that the report and financial statements of the company comply with the current statutory requirements, the requirements of the company's governing document and the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective 1 January 2015).

Principal Activity

The company's objectives are to advance the education of pupils at Parkside Federation Academies and other schools and of the community resident within the City of Cambridge, both young people and adults, maintaining commitments to:

- · Meeting the educational needs and aspirations of the pupils of the Federation;
- · Addressing the educational needs and aspirations and promoting cohesion in the community residents within the City of Cambridge;
- · Equality of access and opportunity for all;
- · Excellence in teaching and learning; and
- · Active collaboration with educational and other partners.

The Trustees are satisfied that the company has achieved its objectives in the year under review.

The Trustees' report

The Trustees meet a minimum of three times a year. The Trustees may appoint and remove up to 4 Trustees or other persons to serve as Members of each Federation Governing Body as they wish. The Trustees have appointed Michael Priestley, Phyl Fincham and Jenny Griffiths as Foundation Governors to the Governing Body of Ridgefield Primary School. Two Trustees, namely Anne Campbell and David Carrington, as well as Ashish Dasgupta and Steve Broad are appointed as Foundation Governors to Parkside Federation Academies. The Trustees are responsible for the appointment of Foundation Governors to the Schools' Governing Bodies and receive Annual Reports from the Chair of Governors. These provide a formal check that the provision of education complies with the charitable objectives of the Foundation. Trustees also receive reports from the Executive Principal and the Facilities Manager.

All Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the Charity is exposed, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the Foundation, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure.

Achievements and Performance

Total incoming resources amounted to £134,088 (2015: £85,541) and after deducting total resources expended of £91,874 (2015: £90,393) and donations of £165,245 (2015: £67,233) net outgoing resources amounted to £123,031 (2015: £72,085).

At the year end unrestricted funds amounted to £352,981 (2015: £476,012).

Financial Review

All resources received and expended are treated as unrestricted funds.

During the year the trust made the following distributions:

- · To Ridgefield Primary School
 - -£5,000 to support safeguarding of students by improvements to the perimeter fencing.
- · To Parkside Federation
 - -£75,000 to support the refurbishment of the main Parkside Campus.
 - -£5,000 to support the refurbishment of the Caretaker's house at Coleridge.
 - -£60,000 as a contribution towards the costs of a project manager to oversee the building at Trumpington.
- To Trumpington Community College
 - -£20,245 to support resources needed before the school could open.

Reserves

Reserves are held to support the schools' budgets if necessary and to provide additional facilities not covered by state funding in any new or redeveloped buildings.

Trumpington Community College - Building completion

The Trustees are delighted to report that the building was formally handed over by the builders to Cambridge County Council in May 2016 as complete, subject to the inevitable snagging. Under the terms of the Building program the Freehold Title of the premises is due to be passed to CCEF, however, this has yet to be completed.

The building was opened by the Duke of Gloucester in October 2016 and has received wonderful reviews from parents, students and staff. There is now a 2 year soft landing programme underway to realise the building's full potential

Notes to the Financial Statements

1 Accounting policies

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the recommendations in Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities published on 16 July 2014, the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015), the Companies Act 2006, the Charities Act 2011 and applicable regulations.

The charity owns 100% of the issued share capital of City of Cambridge Education Limited. The trustees have not prepared group accounts for the year as the subsidiary is dormant and not material to an understanding of the financial statements.

Funds

All resources received and expended are treated as unrestricted.

Incoming resources

Incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are receivable.

Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised in the year in which it is incurred and is allocated to expense headings such as lettings costs and governance costs on a direct basis.

The charity has no employees and no employee related expenditure.

Governance costs

Governance costs are costs associated with the governance of the charity, including legal and regulatory compliance and strategic planning.

Fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost.

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write down the costs of each asset to its estimated residual value over its expected useful life. The depreciation rates in use are:

Solar panels

- over 10 years

Depreciation costs are allocated to activities on the basis of the use of the related assets in those activities. Assets are reviewed for impairment if circumstances indicate that their carrying value may exceed their net realisable value and value in use.

The freehold buildings occupied by Parkside Community College (now Parkside Federation Academies) automatically vested in the Company on approval of foundation status of the College on 1 September 2004. As such the property is held on trust for the benefit of the College and its disposal or alternative use is restricted by the terms of the statute under which Academy status is granted. Therefore, as the risks and rewards of the buildings are with the Academy, it is shown in the accounts of Parkside Federation Academies and not in these financial statements. As detailed in note 4, the land remains with the Foundation.

Notes to the Financial Statements

Agency arrangements

The trust acts as an agent in distributing funds from Cambridge City Council. Payments received and disbursed are excluded from the Statement of Financial Activities. Please see note 11 for further details.

Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at cost less provision for permanent diminution in value.

Interest receivable

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the company; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the Bank.

Financial instruments

The charity only has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at their settlement value with the exception of bank loans which are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

The total incoming resources of the company for the year has been derived from its principal activity wholly undertaken in the UK.

9 Related parties

None of the Trustees, nor any person associated with them has received or is due to receive any remuneration for the year, either directly or indirectly from the Charity's funds.

During the year, invoices were raised from Parkside Federation Academies recharging costs of £116,463 plus VAT (2015: £38,973 plus VAT) and donations of £140,000 (2015: £67,233) payable to Parkside Federation. The balance owing at the year end totalled £75,000 (2015: £nil) and is shown within other creditors.

10 Company limited by guarantee

The company is registered under the Companies Act 2006 and is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the Trustees named on page 1. In the event of the company being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the company. The company is also an exempt charity.

11 Capital Project

The charity is currently undertaking a capital project on behalf of Cambridge City Council. It is effectively acting as agent on the project as the buildings will be handed over to Trumpington Community College at the end of the project. All amounts in respect of this project have been excluded from these accounts as the Trust does not have control over the charitable application of those funds.
